Chair Enough by Alexander Busse and Kuesti Fraun (Germany)

Caring is a serious thing and this film turns it on its head. It's a satirical short about disabled people and how powerful they can be.

Goran by Goran Gostojic and Roberto Santaguida (Serbia)

A short documentary film that takes an intimate look at the despair and joy, the hope and pride in achievement as it is constructed by Goran Gostojic of Novi Sad.

What is perfect and who decides? Curing Perfect is an online graphic novel that fully involves learning disabled people in the creative process, challenging users to think about what it means to be human. People and stories from the online world will break out and continue on social media, in print and live events, letting the audience contribute to the ongoing story. The audience will be meeting the artists and the scientists behind the world of Curing Perfect. Curing Perfect is a partnership between Carousel, University of Birmingham, Alex Peckham and Simon Wilkinson.



2.25-2.35pm OSKA BRIGHT PRESENTS 46/47 by Nadine Heinze and Marc Dietschreit

Daniel is different. He's missing something. He only has 46 chromosomes where 47 should be. 46/47 shows the world "from the other side". Everyone has Downs Syndrome. Those with only 46 chromosomes are considered disabled. Those like Daniel. He is always immediately seen but rarely recognized. He finds himself confronted with prejudice on a daily basis. He is perceived as somehow "different", not as an equal part of society.

TUESDAY 10TH NOVEMBER



7.15-7.45pm Picture this... film Festival presents Idiotas (fools) by Fran Estevez

A red balloon descends from the sky and lands in the magic city of Santiago de Compostela (famous for the Jacobean pilgrimage). A smiling boy and his dog find the balloon and discover a message hanging from it: "deflate me little by little".





8.15-8.30pm Dawn of the Dark Fox by Tom Stubbs and Michael Smith

Community filmmaker Tom is trying to help an autistic animator and artist, Michael, create his dream film. The artist is determined to make a Hollywood drama about a violent demon fox from another dimension, while the filmmaker knows he must make a documentary film that can include the strange imaginary world of the artist, but must also stay in the real world.

8.30-9.50pm Sons and Mothers by Christopher Houghton and Louise Pascale

An all-male theatre troupe set out to create a theatrical love letter to their mothers. As they offer their hearts for the sake of a theatre show complications set in. Not everyone makes it to opening night as we discover unconditional love is a choice. Sons & Mothers is a poignant and intimate portrait of seven surprising individuals whose disability does not stop them from revealing themselves with honesty, grace, and a healthy dose of irreverence.


